PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT FROM WINDOW ROCK JUDICIAL DISTRICT

The Window Rock Judicial District is operating and temporarily performing essential services from the former Supreme Court hearing room at the Butler building in Window Rock, Arizona. (located next to Navajo Nation Vital Records, Census office). Exterior doors to all Navajo Nation Judicial Branch courts and programs are locked for the safety of employees and the public. The Window Rock Judicial District is providing no in-person services at this time.

The preferred method of contact for the Window Rock Judicial District is to email the Court at nnwrcourt@navajo-nsn.gov. Telephone messages for the court may be left at (928) 206-7469. Voice messages will be checked periodically throughout the workday and calls will be returned by Window Rock court staff.

For faxing of documents to the Window Rock District Court, faxes may be sent to (928) 657-8146 until further notice. The dropbox outside the Window Rock District Courts is temporarily unavailable for filing of documents. The public may also communicate with the Window Rock District Court through the postal mail. The mailing address is P.O. Box 5520, Window Rock, AZ 86515.
