Thank you for your expressed interest in the Youth Apprenticeship Program. We anticipate to begin our first session starting in February throughout the Navajo Nation. In this program, youth will have the opportunity to absorb techniques of traditional Diné restorative justice, and simple traditional Diné teachings (k'é, the Diné Journey Stories, sacredness of Diné sacred mountains, and the Diné way of life, etc.). These teachings will be provided to the youth by Navajo community based peacemakers who are skilled counselors and teachers in traditional customs and teachings.

From the Peacemaker Youth Apprenticeship Program, youth apprentices will learn self-awareness, self-confidence, responsibilities, and accountability. In order to achieve the stated learning goals of the program, the youth apprentice will follow a peacemaker to observe and assist in peacemaking sessions and life value engagement sessions. Following the six-week program, it is expected that the youth apprentices will have the skills necessary to lead their own peer-to-peer peacemaking sessions in their schools and community

As an incentive you will be receive Peacemaker Stipend which includes mileage, meals and yeel (peacemaker fee). Upon completion of the program you will receive a letter of recommendation from the Chief Justice of the Navajo Nation, Program Incentives, and once graduated an Hoozhi (Beauty Way Ceremony) will be performed for Apprentices.

Overall, the program aspires to instill leaders of the next generation with a strong sense of Diné cultural foundation that will strengthen them as individuals in their future endeavors. It is the Peacemaking Program's responsibility to promote peacemaking counseling services and to provide education and training on Navajo culture/traditions and other Navajo accepted beliefs to individuals and communities.
