RIGHT TO CONFRONT WITNESSES AGAINST YOU: The defendant gets to watch and hear anyone who is testifying against him/her and to ask questions of them.

RIGHT TO CROSS-EXAMINE WITNESSES: The lawyers for both sides must be allowed to question witnesses that the other side has called.

RIGHT TO TESTIFY AT TRIAL OR REMAIN SILENT WITH NO INFERENCE OF GUILT: The defendant does not have to testify if he does not want to. If he does not testify, his silence is not to be interpreted as an admission of guilt.
